What's Covered:

The course consists of mandatory units and a selection of optional units that will be matched to your job role.

Topics include: Communication, Health and Safety, Laws and legislation, Responsibilities, Policies and Procedures for the Sector, Role of a Care Worker, Equality & Diversity, Adult Safeguarding, Duty of Care, Handling of Information, Infection Control, Professional Development.

Entry Requirements:

The course is ideal for those with an interest in the Health & Social Care Sector and maybe considering a change in career or already working within the environment.

Good level of maths and English required.

Entry is by interview, where your individual needs and career prospects will be discussed. A paid or voluntary workplace must be in place to start this course.

Assessment Information:

Assessment is through observation of performance in the workplace, knowledge and understanding you show through written/oral questioning and assignments and an e-portfolio of supporting evidence is also collated.

Fees and Financial Support:

This course is free for anyone aged 16 – 18.
